And on the 7th of November, Sierra Leone was officially declared Ebola free by the WHO. Our hearts go out to those who lost their lives to this horrible disease. And our sincerest thanks to all those who so bravely fought the toughest and scariest fight!

After 8 months, the schools in Sierra Leone finally reopened on the 14th April this year. Children and youths were very eager to go back to school. For Schooling for Life this meant that we could start the SfL programme again and continue to support young and talented Sierra Leonean youth. Needless to say we were very excited to continue our programme! As the school year was cut short because of Ebola, Schooling for Life decided not to send the students to school yet, even though they opened. However, as everyone had been sitting at home for so long, we wanted our students to get back into the learning mode and therefore, gave our students an extra intensive skills training programme. This would give them a head-start on their English and Maths. Of course, the personal guidance had also started.



A field trip

In May this year, Schooling for Life took her students on a field trip. We visited the agricultural farm of Fresh Salone. Agriculture is a major industry in Sierra Leone that is growing by a steady rate. While the nation is more prominently known for its mining operations, more notably diamonds, its agriculture is the backbone of its economic productivity. We want to thank Fresh Salone for hosting us and teaching our students about the wonderful art of growing vegetables, fruits and flowers.




