New Internship opportunities for our students

We are very proud of our Social work students who have started their internships. Two of the students are working with Don Bosco Fambul, a local Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) that supports street children and youth in need. We are already receiving word from Don Bosco Fambul that our students are proving themselves to be hard workers and proactive thinkers. Our third Social work student is attached to the Family Support Unit (FSU) at the Sierra Leone Criminal Investigation Department, Freetown (CID). FSUs are part of the CID of the Sierra Leone Police and are tasked to deal primarily with physical and sexual assault and cruelty to children. Also this student is generating positive feedback from her supervisors. We are very proud of their achievements already.
