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Progress of our students in the programme

Below are some updates on our students from each year.

Update of batch three students - Matriculation



Our year kicked off with many of our batch three students being accepted into their various departments at their colleges. On Saturday, February 9th, eight of our batch three students had their matriculation into their departments in Milton Margai College of Education & Technology (MMCET). In this group, three are studying Business Administration, two are studying Accounting and Finance, two are studying Building and Civil Engineering, and one Tourism. We are very excited to see how they

progress in their various studies.

On Friday, March 15th, the four I.T. students in batch three also had their matriculation at Bluecrest College. All four students are studying networking. They have already passed both their Basic class exams and N+ exams, both with great scores. Good job I.T. guys, we are proud of you!

In the job market


Schooling for Life prepares students for the job market and equips students with skills that many of their counterparts do not get; this is why our students excel in the job market. They don't only get jobs, but keep them due to their great work ethics and other employability skills. Our batch one students are leading the way in showing what Schooling for Life has taught them. We are happy to see that Patrick Barber, who just received his I.T. diploma, started a position with United Bank for Africa (UBA). He has been working in their Application Enrolment Department as a digital staff member since the 1st of May.

Congratulations also to Abdulai Kamara, a batch two student who studied Social Work. Due to Abdulai's great work, he was offered a position with Don Bosco fambul immediately following his internship. They normally do not hire people without degrees, but they wanted to make an exception for Abdulai!

Currently, more than half of our batch one students are employed, of whom three have been employed for almost two years by the same employer. We can see that the others are on the same path to become successful in the job market. We are very proud of the hard work of our students and wish those in the workforce continued success.

2019/2020 Recruitment process

The Schooling for Life (SfL) application process was officially opened on Monday, the 4th March 2019. The application process serves as the first step of Schooling for Life's recruitment process.





A week of outreach was conducted where Schooling for Life students and staff visited various locations to inform interested individuals about the application process and Schooling for Life. Two of our students from batch one, Alimamy Sesay and Patrick Barber, joined our Operational Manager on radio and television programmes to spread the word. More than seventy-five applications were received at the end of the process.

Interviews of applicants were conducted the first few weeks in April and an Assessment Day occurred on the 30th of April. 20 applicants were invited to be assessed on their Math, English and general knowledge, The week following, applicants and guardian interviews were also conducted to learn more about applicants and their support system. Currently, the management is conducting Due Diligence; the portion of the recruitment process, where Schooling for Life searches for the best institutions for our prospective students.
