Speaking on the event was Country Director Sjierly Pereira, who welcomed everyone and recalled the time spent with the graduates preparing them for their next steps in their lives. Other speakers were Patrick J. Mambu, the first prefect of this batch and Moses Bangura, the Math trainer, who spoke about how proud he is of what the students have achieved. The celebrations ended with the awarding of certificates.

### Trainers Reflection Moses Bangura Mathematics trainer

" My principle of teaching is that the trainer must care deeply about the class and be fully invested in the students' learning. To show my investment, I show up early for class respond quickly to phone calls and try to give substantive feedback on students' work. I learn my students' names early on. I intentionally convey my passion and enthusiasm through my words and my body language. I tell my students that I expect to learn much from them As they from me, and I ask for their input on how to improve the class. I always encourage students empower them to take ownership of the

class. Over the years I've been with Schooling for Life, I've had the pleasure of working with many different students. I've seen students come in with a good amount of knowledge in mathematics and improve. I have trained students with almost no knowledge on the subject and I have seen them improve. Students have taken the skills they've acquired from SFL and have gone on to succeed in life. I am proud to say I am a part of this programme and I am able to contribute to the success of young people in our country. Thanks to SFL for giving me the opportunity to make a difference."

Through my years at Schooling for Life, both as a student and as an Intern -Trainer for computer skills, I gained a lot of new skills and experience. During my internship at SfL, I learned new things like developing computer skills curriculum and preparing lesson plans. Submitting documents by email can be a stumbling block for people my age nut SfL staff were really helpful in walking me through things I didn't know. My training in communication, time management and work ethics are all skills that I am currently putting into



use and are helping me to thrive in my place of work."



#### Master class 2019!!

As part of Schooling for Life's key skills development, and learning opportunity provided for its students, a master class for all batch two, three and four students was organized on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at the Africell American Corner. The session was designed and facilitated by Mr. Mokay Kamara.

The aim and objectives of the master class was to provoke thought, discussion and learning on positive leadership skills as a personal development objective through the application of emotional intelligence. The main discussions points and topics included: -

- 1. Self-identity and discovery
- 2. Leadership and leadership theories
- 3. Communication skills of a good leader
- 4. Leadership styles
- 5. Emotional intelligence

The facilitator used a range of presentation tools and techniques to keep the students engaged throughout the two-hour session including PowerPoint presentations, activities, games and videos

The first activity was an opportunity for the student to say who, were and what their desired superpower could be or greatest achievement or life lesson learnt.

Students were also provided the opportunity to say who they viewed as strong leaders in their community and why. Examples of positive leaders were discussed including the common trait among these leaders identified as emotional intelligence.

Students found the 'Chinese Whispers' activity and the numbers game most interesting due to the high level of animation and cognitive skills required for the activity.

At the end of the session there was an opportunity for students to complete an exercise on individual leadership skills and develop a personal action plan.

Students were also able to ask questions throughout, and at the end of the session.
