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SCHOOLING FOR LIFE IS GOING GLOBAL AND ONLINE

Over 6,5 years, we have been able to support 45 students with scholarships, employability skills classes, and guidance in their behavioural change and character building. Through our students, the trainers we have trained and the outreach we have done, we have impacted over 3000 people in the period that we have been operational in Sierra Leone.

Over 85% of our students who have completed the Skills for a Successful Future programme have found and kept their job within a year after leaving the programme.

Incentivised by the COVID-19 situation and our wish to reach more people around the world, we are embarking on a new adventure and moving our work online. Our objective to bring youth and employers together in low- and middle-income countries and help upskill employees on local job markets remains the same. Our transition will however mean that we will close our physical space and programme in Sierra Leone. Of course, we will continue to support our batch four students in their second year.


The new course will be a more professional paid course that will be launched online, focused on the needs of employers regarding employability skills and behavioural change for their employees. Additionally, we will focus on organisations working with youth to help them prepare for the job market, and youth on an individual basis, all in low- and middle-income countries on a global level. Schooling for Life will not be giving out scholarships anymore nor perform any face to face training in Sierra Leone.

CONTINUATION OF THE THIRD SEMESTER SKILLS CLASSES ONLINE



At the start of April 2020, the programme had to be paused due to COVID-19 measures. Schooling for Life started exploring alternative options to continue the third-semester employability skills classes for our batch three and four students. Not knowing how long the measures would remain in place, we wanted to make sure to build a sustainable platform that

could accommodate all classes. We conducted a pilot phase with two of our students from batch three and four to assess the accessibility and user-friendliness of the e-learning platform on phones and in local context. Once that aspect proved to work well, SfL continued building the e-learning platform for the remaining subjects of the third semester: English Language, Mathematics and Works Ethics – with Time Management to be addressed at the end, in collaboration with KOMO (see insert).

The SfL third-semester skills classes were officially launched on the 6th of July 2020. To facilitate this initiative for the students, SfL created a video and PDF tutorial on how to use the platform, bought smartphones for students who couldn't afford one (on loan), and provided mobile data for all students throughout the semester to facilitate access to the online classes. With the COVID-19 measures in the country slightly softening in July 2020, SfL discussed with the trainers to hold the third-semester exams in the office in small groups.

Overall, the online third semester was a big success. The students enjoyed the new experience while being able to continue their education. This led SfL to carefully reflect and decide to continue on this route for the continuation of the organisation.

SCHOOLING FOR LIFE COLLABORATION WITH KOMO

Komo is a company that focuses on online skills building for and mentoring of youth. It focuses on helping youth develop critical thinking and cognitive skills to enhance learning in general. Based on the alignment in our strategies, KOMO and SfL decided to join forces. KOMO very generously donated components of its online course to facilitate SfL's Time Management module. The donated modules were checked on context sensitivity and understandability for our students. In addition, complementary trainings were developed by SfL to cover all subjects within the SfL Time Management curriculum. The Time Management module - 7 weeks - eventually evolved to be a much broader life management and general planning skills module. For this reason, SfL asked KOMO to offer the module to both batch 3 and 4 students, as even though batch 3 had already gone through the Time Management module in their first year, the course as it had developed, gave them great additional value in their critical thinking and planning skills. KOMO agreed and donated the module to SfL for 19 students.

SCHOOLING FOR LIFE WINDING DOWN MEETINGS WITH STUDENTS AND GUARDIANS

As Schooling for Life was about to close its physical space (office) in Sierra Leone, we made sure to inform all relevant stakeholders about our new adventure. In November 2020, we had different meetings in smaller groups at the SfL's office; with all students as well as with the guardians. In these meetings, we discussed the organisation's plans to go global and online, and what that would mean for the students.

We assured the current students (batch four) about our continuous support in order for them to finish the two-year programme.

GRADUATION CEREMONY FOR BATCH TWO AND THREE STUDENTS



Due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and its restrictions, SfL was not able to hold the graduation ceremony for batch two students, as planned.

However, after careful consideration, on the 12th of December 2020, we held a graduation ceremony for 28 students; 2 students from batch one, 13 students from batch two, and 13 students from batch three. The batch three students, who

have not yet completed their scholarships, received a confirmation letter of completion of the employability skills classes and personal guidance and will receive their official

certificates upon completion of their studies. As we are winding down in Sierra Leone, we did want them to have the experience of the graduation ceremony together with their peers.

It became a day full of motivational speeches, achievement awards and fun!
